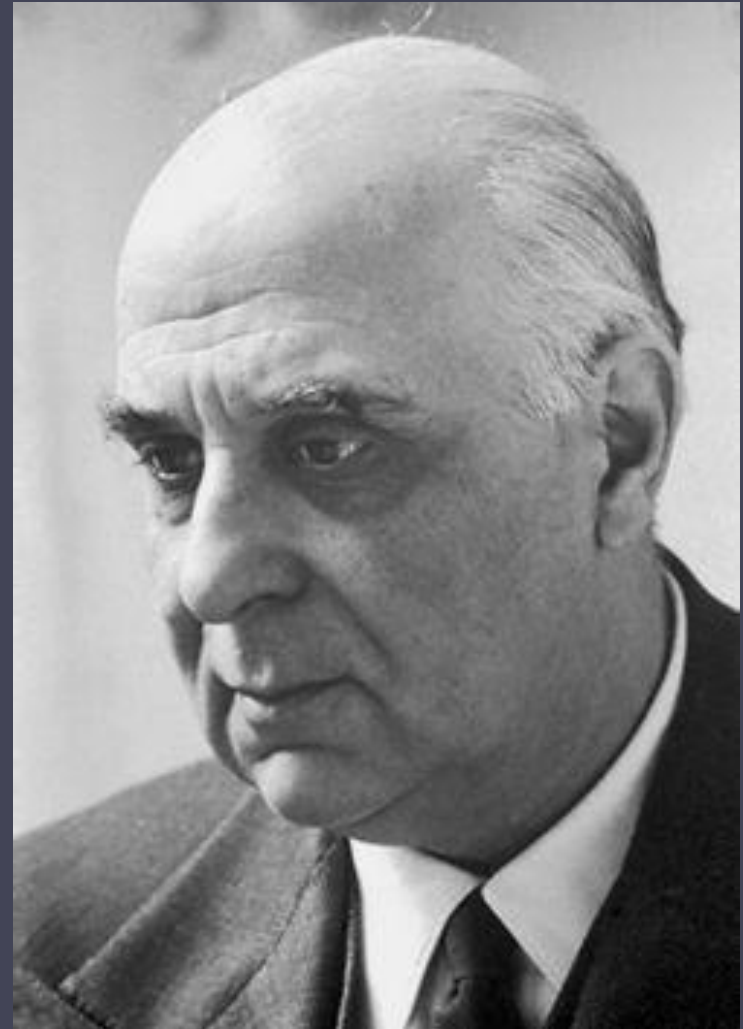


“Aeolian land”, one of his most important works, dedicated to his homeland, was translated in many languages,

Giorgos Seferis, a Greek poet from the area of Smyrna, in Asia Minor



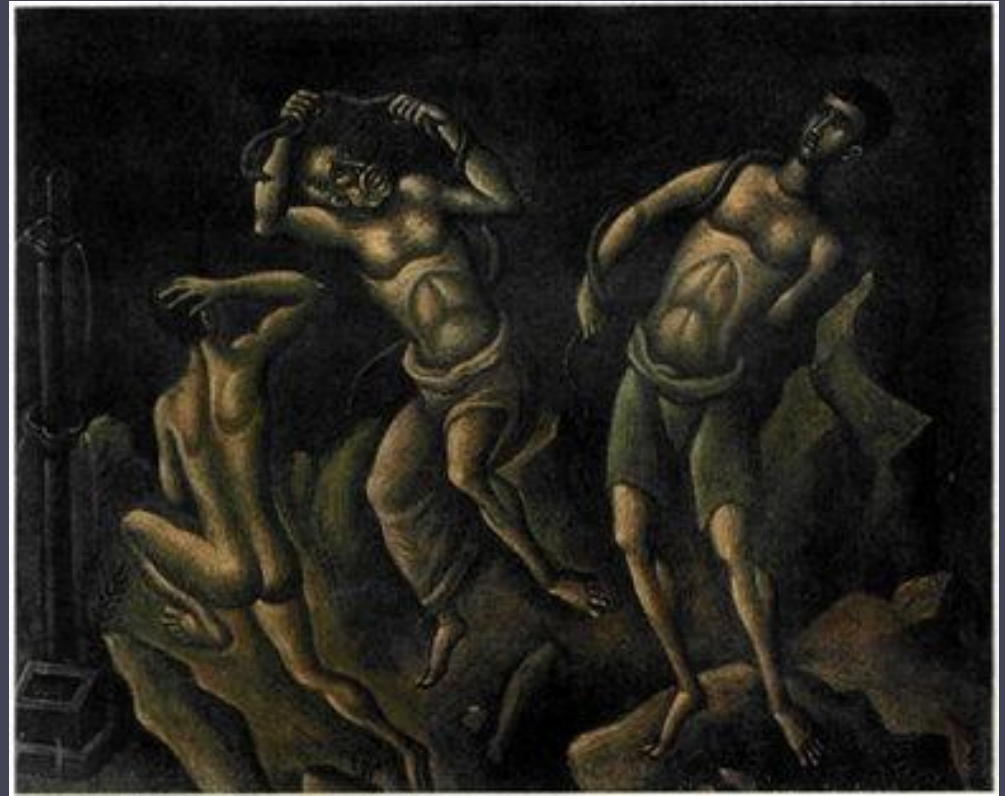
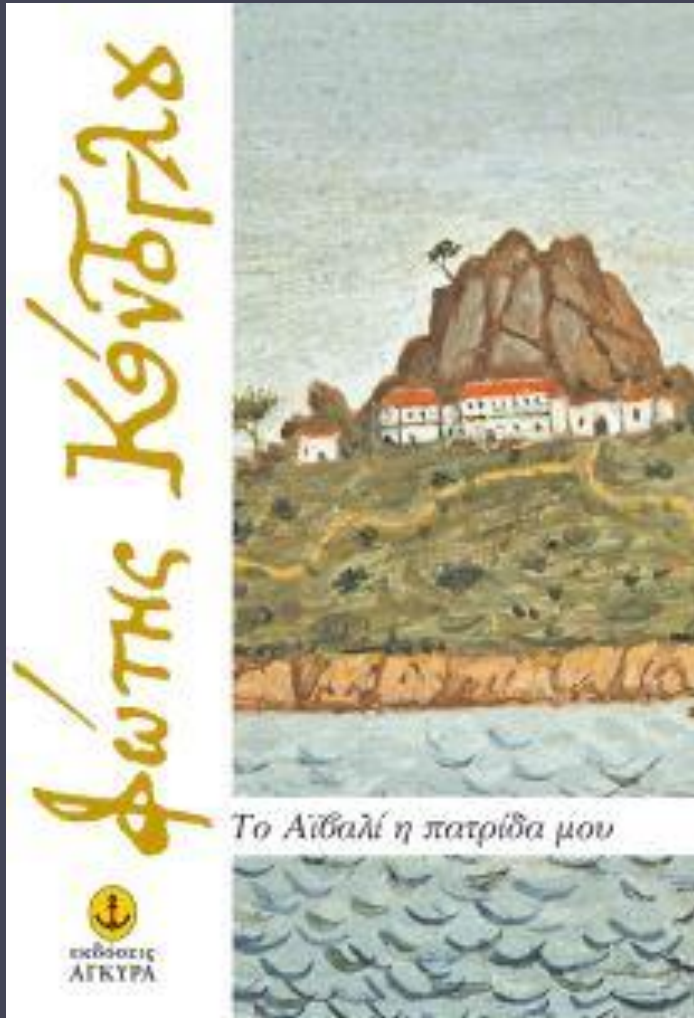


He came to Greece when the First World War broke out. A great poet, winner of the Nobel Prize for Literature, he influenced Greek poetry during the decade of 1930 and later.

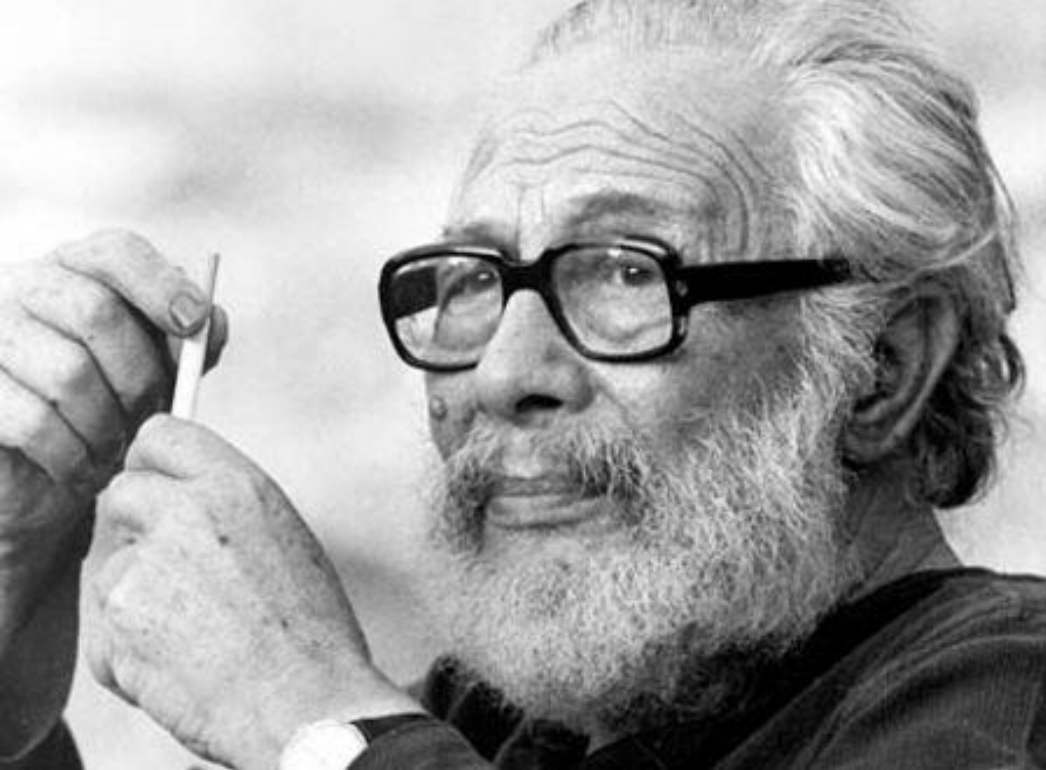
Fotis Kontoglou

(Ottoman Empire)



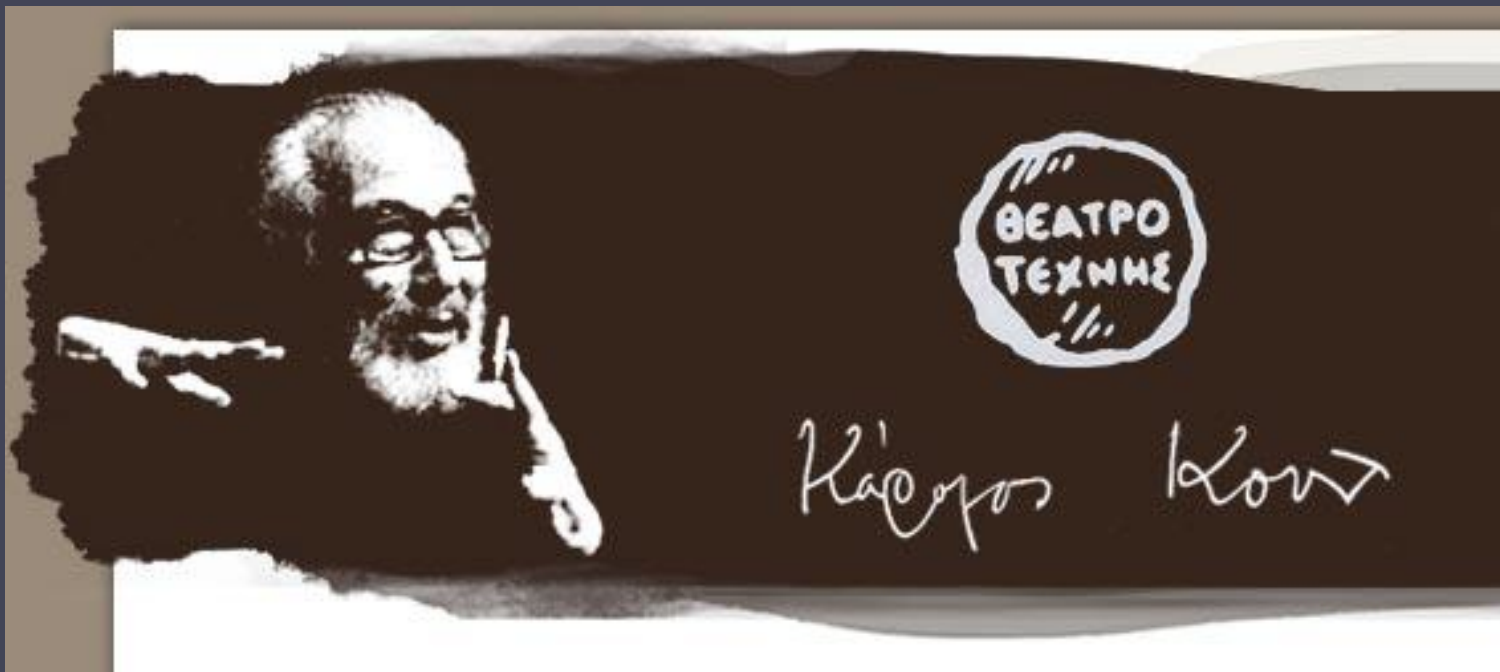
Famous for his book about his homeland and for his Byzantine – like style of painting. He influenced many contemporary Greek painters.

Sophia Vembo



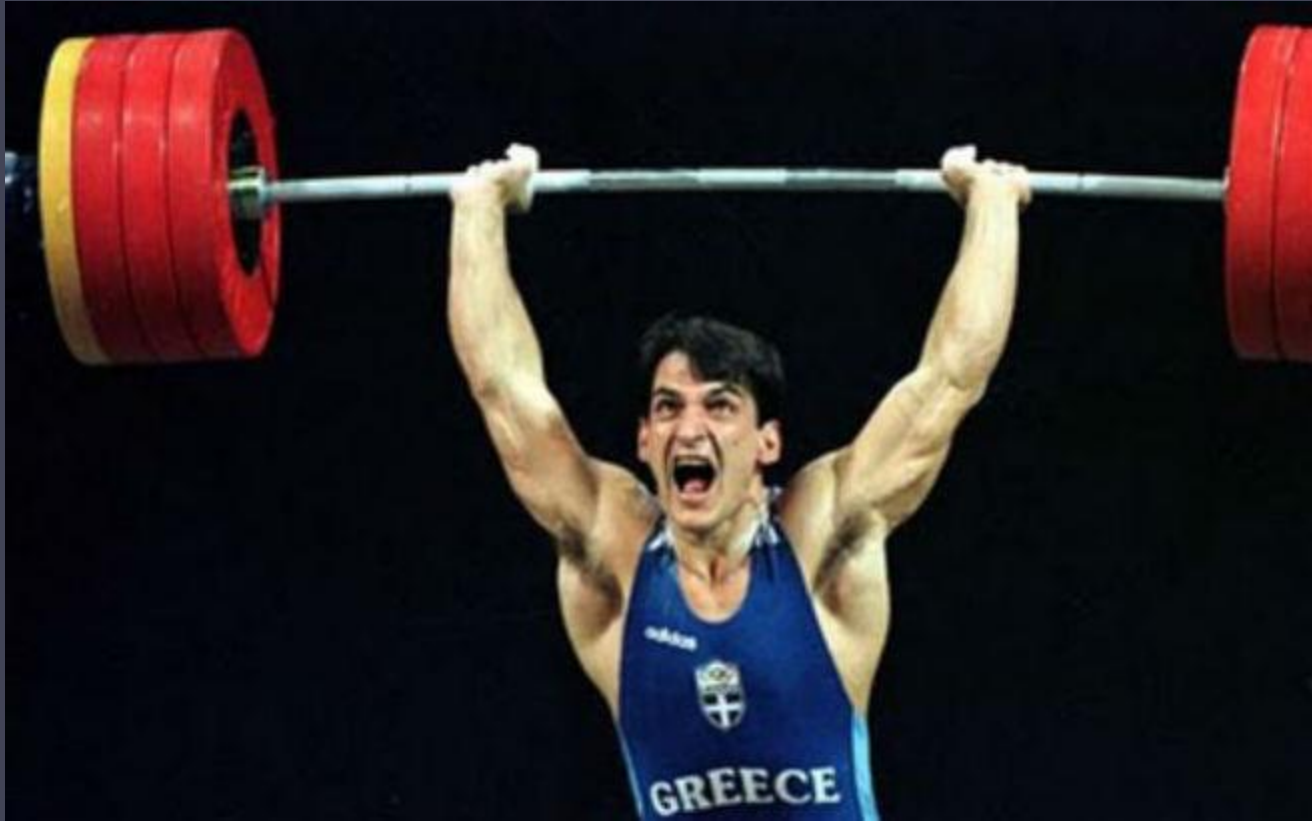
Greek singer, born in East Thrace (Turkey)

Born in Albania, son of a Greek mother and an Albanian father.

Photographer from Albania, lives in Athens and works for the agency Magnum Photos

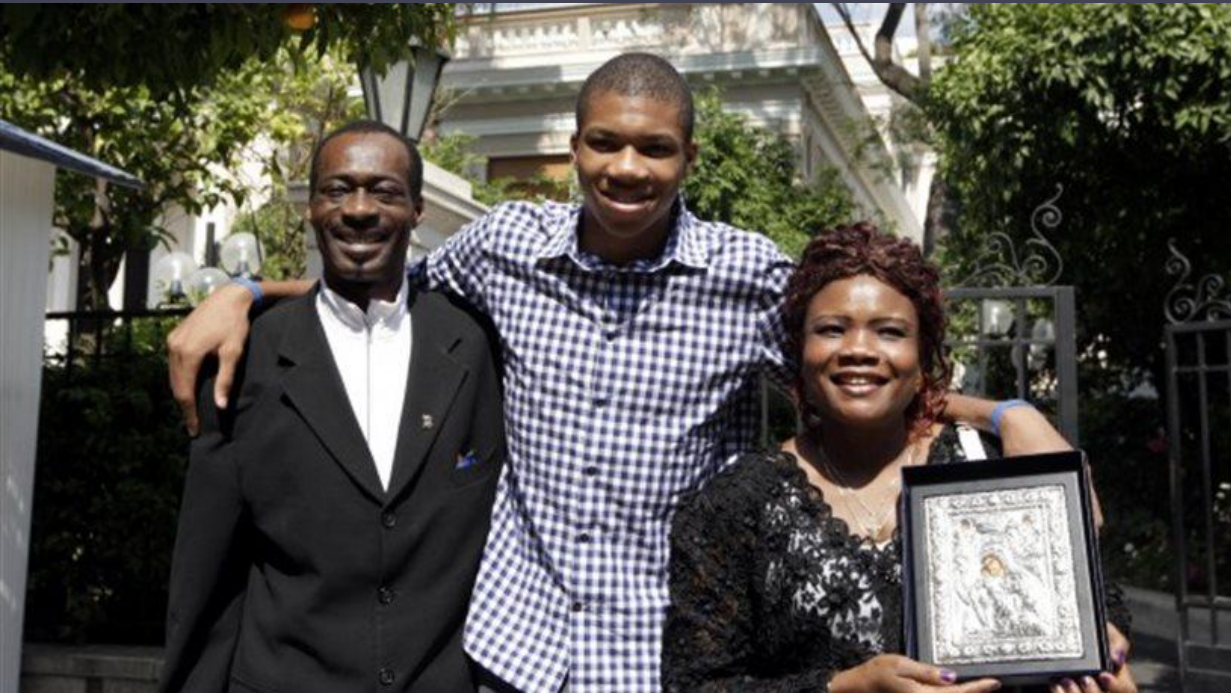
